100 disposable cameras are hidden in Wicker Park Bucktown. Find one and "takemewithyou." Tell it a story, then mail it back. The neighborhood's collective experiences are then shared in-store and online.

MORE THAN CLOUDS IN THE SKY

CRT presents a robotic theater piece loosely based on Galileo Galilei. Our story involves Friedric, and the town's people who don't believe his observation of flying things.

RECYCLED LIGHT

Jeff Snider's installation is a full-sized living room comprised of functional illuminated sculptures constructed out of repurposed materials. These pieces promote the sustainable eco-friendly trends of future commerce.
